- [Better roads, slightly longer from south]* From South on A449 or from North on A40 take the A40 slip road to Abergavenny/Y Fenni in 1.1 mi at the roundabout, take the 4th exit onto Clytha Rd brown sign for Pont Kemys (take care easy to miss) in 4.5 mi Turn left onto B4598 in 2.4 mi Turn left to Pont Kemys

Additional Information

We are delighted that you are interested in coming on the Usk Rally. It is held in a beautiful part of Wales but with the attractions and shopping of Cardiff and Hereford only 40 minutes away and Newport only 30 minutes.

Attractions include

A particular favourite of ours is the **St Fagans National History Museum**. It is 45 minutes from the site. Described as a walk around Wales – from Celtic times to the present-day St Fagans is one of Europe's leading open-air museums and Wales's most popular heritage attraction and admission is free! But you pay £5 to park take £1 coins. Open to the public since 1 November 1948, the museum stands in the grounds of the magnificent St Fagans Castle and gardens, a late 16th-century manor house donated to the people of Wales by the Earl of Plymouth. Since 1948 over forty original buildings from different historical periods have been re-erected in the 100-acre parkland, among them houses, a farm, a school, a chapel and a splendid Workmen's Institute. The Museum is one of the UK's top ten free attractions as voted by users of TripAdvisor, the world's largest travel review site. You can bring your dog to St Fagans, provided it is kept on a short lead. They can only let guide dogs into the historic buildings www.museum.wales/stfagans/

Usk Rural Life Museum In the picturesque and historic riverside town of Usk, is a museum run by dedicated volunteers with “one of the best collections of its kind in Britain”. Housed in an ancient malt barn with adjacent buildings, the Museum has 5000+ exhibits collected by local enthusiasts over the past 50 years to preserve the heritage of the life and work of country people in the Welsh Borders from Victorian times and onwards. The museum houses a unique collection of over 5000 artefacts from the smallest hand tools and household items through to large agricultural machinery and vintage tractors. The museum portrays rural life in Monmouthshire covering a period of approximately 100 years from 1850 – 1950. Specialist collections include a Victorian cottage, a forge, carts, a cobbler, cheese making, WWII (including a bomb!), a stable, a hardware shop and many more. www.uskmuseum.org/blog/

There is also the National Trust's **Tredegar House**, only 30 minutes from the site. Seat of the influential Morgan family for 500 years, this flamboyant restoration mansion is one of the most significant examples of its kind in Britain. Their walled gardens are some of the most important early eighteenth century garden landscapes in Wales. Over the years they've changed and developed as new fashions took hold and they bloomed or suffered as the Morgan family's fortunes rose and fell. www.nationaltrust.org.uk/tredegar-house

The remarkable **Newport Transporter Bridge** is one of only six operational transporter bridges left worldwide from a total of twenty constructed. The bridge opened in 1906 and has dominated the Newport skyline ever since. A transporter bridge is basically a suspended ferry that can operate more efficiently than a conventional ferry. A high-level boom that allows ships to pass underneath is suspended from towers at each end. The boom carries a rail track on which a moving carriage or 'traveller' runs. A gondola or platform is suspended from the carriage and can be pulled from one side of the river to the other by means of a hauling cable. The Transporter Bridge is powered by twin 35 horse power electric motors. www.newport.gov.uk/heritage/Transporter-Bridge/Transporter-Bridge.aspx

The Real Underground Experience - **Big Pit National Coal Museum**. Big Pit is a real coal mine and one of Britain's leading mining museums, and admission is free. With facilities to educate and entertain all ages, Big Pit is an exciting and informative day out. Enjoy a multi-media tour of a modern coal mine with a virtual miner in the Mining Galleries, exhibitions in the Pithead Baths and Historic colliery buildings. All this AND the world-famous Underground Tour. Go 300 feet underground with a real miner and see what life was like for the thousands of men who worked at the coal face. An award-winning national museum that still retains many features of its former life as a coal mine, standing high on the heather-clad moors of Blaenafon, the tunnels and buildings that once echoed to the sound of the miners now enjoy the sound of the footsteps and chatter of visitors from all over the world. www.museum.wales/bigpit/

The Royal Mint Experience, 50 minutes from the site is the only place in the world where you can watch the United Kingdom's coins being made. Go behind the scenes to follow the journey of a coin from a blank to a bank in our 45-minute Guided Factory Experience. After your Factory Experience, wander at your own pace through the Interactive Exhibition, discovering the incredible processes needed to make a coin. Come face to face with British monarchs over the past 1,000 years. Get up close to the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic medals, and listen to the stories of those whose bravery has been rewarded with the UK's gallantry and service medals. <https://www.royalmint.com/the-royal-mint-experience>

Other Attractions: Chainbridge Pub 300yds, Usk Farmers Market Saturday; Black Bear Pub and Restaurant 1 mile; The Foxhunter Pub 1 mile; Fishing available nearby; Pony trekking at Abergavenny; Roman Fortress and baths at Caerleon; Raglan, Skenfrith and Abergavenny castles; Windsurfing, sailing and trout fishing at Llandegfedd Reservoir; Access to the Usk Valley Walk nearby; Millennium Stadium, Cardiff within 40 minutes; Monmouthshire & Brecon Canal within 10 minutes; Local market at Abergavenny on Tuesday.
